

## WELCOME TO NORTH COVE

On behalf of the Old Saybrook Harbor Management Commission, we welcome you to the cove and to the Town of Old Saybrook. We hope you enjoy your stay. Here is a summary of the rules for transient boaters along with some tips and other information.

- Vacant moorings are available free of charge for transient use on a first-come first-served basis. Moorings cannot be reserved and are privately owned so please treat them as if they were your own—you are responsible for securing to a mooring that is suitable for your vessel any damages caused to the mooring or other vessels.
- Vacant moorings are identified by a yellow ribbon. You can also hail the North Cove Yacht Club on Channel 78a during normal business hours where someone may be able to help you identify potentially vacant moorings. No vessel in excess of 45' in length or 15' in beam is permitted to moor or anchor in North Cove.
- The maximum stay is 72 hours; you must leave the cove for a minimum of 7 days between stays, and you need to stay on your vessel overnight. If the mooring holder returns, you must promptly vacate the mooring. The Town also maintains 3 townowned moorings which are available for transient use.
- The Sheffield Street Town Dock is on the southwestern end of the cove. Dinghies can be tied to the dinghy dock for reasonable periods of time. Water and trash disposal are available.
- The North Cove Yacht Club offers a launch service and access to its facilities for a fee. The club is located slightly north of the Town Dock.
- Depths range from 6 feet at mean low tide in the western two thirds of the cove and 12 feet at the eastern one third.
- Pump out services are provided by the Lower Connecticut River Pump Out Boat. Hail them on Channel 72 to see when they will be in the area.
- Main Street is a short walk west up Sheffield Street. There you will find provisions, supplies, restaurants, coffee shops and a hardware store. A full service super market is a longer walk / very short cab or Uber ride. A well-stocked West Marine is a modest cab or Uber ride away.
- You are encouraged to text your contact information to the Harbor Master in case we need to get in contact with you.
