The Town of Old Saybrook does not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission to, access to, or operations of its programs, services, or activities. The Town of Old Saybrook does not discriminate on the basis of disability in its hiring or employment practices.

The Town of Old Saybrook will make all reasonable modifications to policies and programs to ensure that people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to enjoy its programs, services, and activities. The ADA does not require the Town to take any action that would fundamentally alter the nature of its programs or services, or impose an undue financial or administrative burden. In addition, requests may be denied if they would result in a direct threat to the health or safety of the requestor or others.
