The intent of this document is to provide a daily summary of preparedness, response and other government activities.


Public Safety & Community Information

- The Nation, State, and Town remain under Declared States of Emergency.
- The Town's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) remains operational.
- There were two (2) new CONFIRMED cases of COVID-19 today in Old Saybrook.
- Old Saybrook belongs to the Connecticut River Area Health District (CRAHD).
- This includes the Towns of Chester, Clinton, Deep River, Haddam, and Old Saybrook.
- These are the current reported Positive Cases according to CRAHD:

Chester - 31 Confirmed Cases 6 Deaths
 Clinton - 30 Confirmed Cases 2 Deaths

Deep River - 9 Confirmed Cases
 Haddam - 18 Confirmed Cases
 Old Saybrook - 21 Confirmed Cases

■ The chart below shows confirmed COVID – 19 cases in Old Saybrook by date.



- We've been discussing the possibility of the COVID-19 Infection period peaking this week.
- Today, Middlesex Hospital experienced increased admissions of COVID-19 Positive Patients.
- The best thing we can do to prevent community spread is to practice social distancing.
- Stay in groups of five (5) people or less.
- Keep six (6) feet distance from others. (Even in small groups!)
- Wear a mask while you are in public.
- Stay home if you do not have to go out.
- Try to stay in your own yard when getting fresh air and some sun.
- Avoid public places if possible.
- We want things to return to normal too! But it's too soon! COVID-19 is still spreading.
- You can have COVID-19 and not have symptoms for many days.
- During that time you can pass COVID-19 to others, including your friends and loved ones.
- This is one of the reasons we are mandated to wear masks!
- PLEASE adhere to the Governor's Order and wear a mask in public! It will stop the spread.
- The Emergency Operations Center is working on a Face Mask for all Program for OS Citizens.

- Please report those that are not following the law.
- The Public Safety Leadership Team met today with the First Selectman.

Public School District

- The Public School District served 326 students breakfast and lunch today.
- The District is working on plans for year end grading and activities, by getting input from educators, parents, and students.
- The Superintendent and School Administrators are maintaining open communication with all students, parents, and staff.

Public Health

- It is extremely important that EVERYONE takes this Public Health Emergency seriously!
- Restaurants MUST close their outdoor eating areas to the public.
- Your emotional health is very important as well!
- Set a limit on media consumption, including social media, local or national news.
- Stay hydrated and avoid excessive amounts of caffeine or alcohol. (Please!)
- Connect with loved ones and others who may be experiencing stress about the outbreak.
- Talk about your feelings and enjoy conversation unrelated to the outbreak.

- The Town Hall will be OPEN tomorrow. Assistance is available by appointment.
- If you needed a building or zoning permit before the pandemic, you still need one now!
