COVID 19 Community UPDATE #65 – June 1, 2020

The following Community Update is being provided to you from the
Town of Old Saybrook Emergency Operations Center.

The intent of this document is to provide a summary of preparedness, response and
other government activities.

Public Safety & Community Information

- The Nation, State, and Town remain under Declared States of Emergency.
- The Town’s Emergency Operations Center (EOC) remains operational.
- There were no new CONFIRMED cases of COVID-19 in Old Saybrook since Friday.
- Old Saybrook belongs to the Connecticut River Area Health District (CRAHD).
- This includes the Towns of Chester, Clinton, Deep River, Haddam, and Old Saybrook.
- There were new CONFIRMED cases of COVID-19 in our Health District since Friday.
- These are the current reported Positive Cases according to CRAHD:

-	Chester	-	46 Confirmed Cases	10 Deaths
-	Clinton	-	59 Confirmed Cases	3 Deaths
-	Deep River	-	13 Confirmed Cases	2 Deaths
-	Haddam	-	36 Confirmed Cases	1 Death
-	Old Saybrook	-	33 Confirmed Cases	
- In addition to Old Saybrook’s residential cases listed above, Apple Rehab now has 51 COVID-19 Positive Patients. 19 staff members have also tested positive.
- There have been ten (10) patients from Apple Rehab that succumbed to COVID-19. Our condolences to the families and staff members caring for them.
- To give perspective there are approximately 83 residents at Apple.
- Town Officials contacted the State Department of Public Health again today regarding the matter at Apple Rehab. They are the ONLY agency that regulates the Rehab Facility.
- We expressed our detailed concerns about the staffing levels at the facility and that Apple is still admitting new patents in the middle of a COVID-19 Outbreak.
- The State inspected the facility last Wednesday. Findings will be public this week.
- Based on the information that is being shared with us, we DO NOT feel that the matter at Apple Rehab will cause a Community Spread Problem.
- Gladeview Healthcare has voluntarily tested all 104 residents. None have symptoms.

- Gladeview has communicated to the Regional Health District that ALL tests results have been received – All are negative!
- The Town stands at the ready to support Apple Rehab and/or Gladeview Healthcare should they need any assistance.
- Wear a mask to prevent Community Spread. We are counting on you!
- Still need face masks? Not able to make it last week? No problem!
- Simply stop by the Police Department, provide proof of residency, and get your masks!
- Restaurants that wish to apply for additional outdoor seating or the placement of tents will find the simplified application forms and instructions at the following link:
