COVID 19 Community UPDATE #75 – July 7, 2020

The following Community Update is being provided to you from the

Town of Old Saybrook Emergency Operations Center.

The intent of this document is to provide a summary of preparedness, response and other government activities.

Public Safety & Community Information

- The Nation, State, and Town remain under Declared States of Emergency.
- The Town's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) remains operational.
- There was one new CONFIRMED case of COVID-19 in OS since our last report.
- Old Saybrook belongs to the Connecticut River Area Health District (CRAHD).
- This includes the Towns of Chester, Clinton, Deep River, Haddam, and Old Saybrook.
- There were new CONFIRMED cases of COVID-19 in our District since our last report.
- These are the current reported Positive Cases according to CRAHD:
 - Chester 46 Confirmed Cases 10 Deaths
 - Clinton 69 Confirmed Cases 4 Deaths
 - Deep River 18 Confirmed Cases 2 Deaths
 - Haddam 37 Confirmed Cases 1 Death
 - Old Saybrook 42 Confirmed Cases 2 Deaths
- The virus is STILL here! We must continue to take precautions in order to stay safe!
- There was much activity in Town this weekend with not so much social distancing......

■ We are enjoying the fact that COVID-19 transmission is at an all time low, HOWEVER, we are very mindful of what is happening in other States around the country – you should be too!.

■ If we were not concerned, Phase Three (3) Reopening activities would not have been indefinitely delayed. This proactive measure should give us some pause.

■ We are doing everything we can think of to maintain a low COVID-19 Transmission rate and to prevent the Community Spread of the virus. Please help us out! WEAR A MASK!!

■ Three (3) additional states have been added to the list of States that if you are travelling to Connecticut from, you MUST quarantine for fourteen (14) days!

The States included now are Alabama, Arkansas, Arizona, California, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Iowa, Idaho, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Nevada, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Utah ■ Remember you can't see the virus, you don't know where it is, you don't know if you have the virus, but you do know how to protect yourself and others...please do so!

- Still need face masks? No problem! We have them at the Police Department for you!
