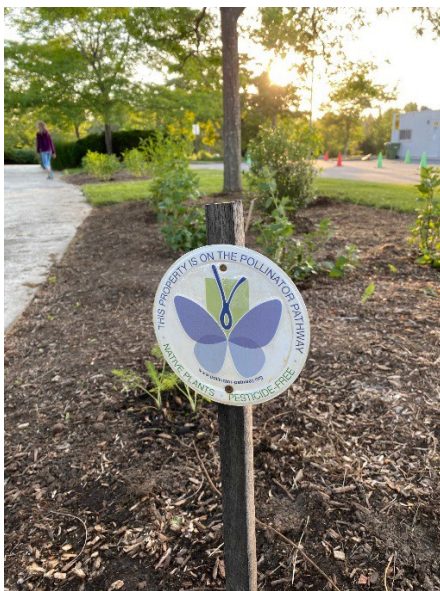
Pollinator pathways are pesticide-free corridors of native plants that provide nutrition and habitat for bees and butterflies. Gardens along the pathway can be any size, even a flower box!

The metal signs are \$10 (6" size) and \$20 (12" size). All profits from sign sales go towards establishing and maintaining pollinator gardens in public spaces around Old Saybrook.
