Feedback: Ongoing conversations with entire community (town residents, members of school community, town partners/organizations, etc.) on how to move forward.

Assessing community needs/Committee Work-

Recovery taskforce (YFS- emotional wellness & social services component includes church leaders, clinicians and medical professionals)

Consistent message- Adaptable & Flexible. Prioritizing competing demands within the agency and beyond requires flexibility. Who/what needs our attention 1<sup>st</sup> and how to adapt accordingly.

Taking care of staff needs/schedules, being able to see clients via tele-health or outside off-site, etc.

Fall 2020 for Mental Health Services-

Interns (4 CCSU, 1 U. Central FL, 1 Rutgers) to help facilitate school-age youth programs and meetings (virtually), community/parent groups (virtually), education/resources/support- national recovery month, also teacher & staff support available. YFS clinicians' suicide prevention training for community.

Holiday Giving- last year over 80+ families, approximately 200 children. Due to COVID, this year process has changed. Gift cards only. Letters to donors giving parents the autonomy to purchase the gifts. Will provide wrapping paper/bows. Deadline before Thanksgiving.

Chief Spera – re: process for Turkey Drive – TBD

SEARCH Institute survey (not this year) -4 core measures will be discussing possible options TBD.

H.McNeil – want to continue to find out from student reps- "what's important to you and your peers?" and "what can the commission do to help?"

Estuary Council looking for drivers for Meals on Wheels Tues/Thurs 10-12. Currently YFS program coordinators B. Eckert & W. Mill driving. Would like to get 18-24 yrs. to assist.

L. Castro- college-students currently living at home? Need to get the word out via social media. OS does have the electronic signs -very informative.

	H. MNeil asks how 1 <sup>st</sup> day of school went for all?
	D. Plotkin- nice to be able to be back in the classroom. L. Castro- great to see them "smiles" behind the mask, remaining socially distanced, parents understandably a little anxious but most willing to help and be understanding.  L.
