OSHS LINK crew very similar to YFS YAC leaders we've had for many years (same make-up) New LINK facilitator at OSHS was glad to have YFS support the LINK crew Looking for a 2<sup>nd</sup> Link facilitator (perhaps YFS program coordinator?) would be a natural partnership and great connection. Chief Spera's feedback from his sophomore at home - impressed with both YFS & Camp Hazen staff. Loved the interactive games. He was not able to attend as a freshman due to the COVID restrictions last year. However he felt that it was better to go as a sophomore – as friend groups change from middle to high school, it was more comfortable going as a sophomore and transition with other groups. Rethinking the overnight aspect that has been done in the past. Discuss the same model done this year. In School Programming Work closely with L. Castro, J. Taylor, and S. Diaz. 4 new CCSU MFT interns (1st year) on school-based track Alyssa P. 2<sup>nd</sup> year MFT intern will help mentor as well. S. Shea (former YFS intern) now hired at OSHS Working closely with Kathy Bai After School Programming Grades 5-6 begin Sept 20 @ 2:50-4:30pm (3 week model) Other programs TBD United Way Funding Early Childhood – not awarded this year. Had been received for 11 yrs. Was not intended to receive forever. Assets in Action – new award base 12 YSB in our group \$30K (now about \$2K per YSB) substantially less but will even out with other programs, etc. Other New Families (of 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> graders) provide an orientation to community. PK-4 had the Picnic and Play group. Contracted with a service Boost Lingo (interpreter) for social services and any YFS any programs to connect with marginalized groups or people who are not getting the information. Example: communicate back-to-school event

Marijuana – under discussion - planning to put forth a moratorium not to allow any retail establishment in Old Saybrook for a certain time TBD.

Back-to-School Supply Event – OSPD school supplies, drive-thru operation to give out backpacks and fill with any school supplies needed. Over 100+ attended.
