## **ARPA Funding**

- Application process 9-10 mos long. Funding approved by BOF last week.
- Town mtg. Nov 28<sup>th</sup> encourage town residents vote to approve.
- Social Services \$242K and YFS \$95K mental health services for youth & students, positive youth development, programming, etc.
- Additional 3hrs/week for licensed clinician increased rate of service, increasing trends, suicide prevention
- An available bi-lingual MSW challenging to find at this time heavily utilized elsewhere & at much higher pay rates. Need approved. Outreach work between student, schools & family, bridge the gap. Specialized position for clinical work.
- Part-time Prevention Program Coordinator approved for additional hours.
- L. Castro commented it is a hard time finding bi-lingual therapists

## December community/parent/caregiver survey

- Original student survey that was presented to district & school leadership did not get approval at this time. Maybe next academic year.
- This new survey is not as substantial as original. Some data for post-covid. Need data to support. Hope to identify needs within the community, student mental health, areas of needs, etc.
- Superintendent did agree to distribute via parent/grandparent/caregivers email database in order to reach community; access to the students. English and Spanish. Gather information to write grants.
- Always looking for ways to connect, communicate w/people throughout the community
- Rebuilding connections "have you or anyone you know utilized any YFS programs?" Wilderness, YAC, mental health services, social services, etc.

#### Staffing

 Vacancy: 1 part-time Prevention Program Coordinator. Challenging as other YSBs using ARPA funding to hire as full-time position with higher rate of pay and benefits. Need to be more qualified than this position previously written for.
